MG TO RALLY FOR CHILDREN'S CANCER

Michigan Chapter member John Deikis remembers the first day he sat in the waiting room at the U of M Hospital Cancer Center. It was early 1998 and John had been diagnosed with cancer of the larynx. He was successfully treated with a then-new procedure of laser surgery.

But what he remembers most clearly are the young kids who shared the waiting room with him. On a recently started blog, he wrote: "I had lived more than half of my life in good health, married to one woman, father of two sons, having traveled around the world, achieved a doctoral degree, and enjoyed hobbies and a successful professional career in health care. Children with cancer often don't get a chance like that. Before their lives really start, they face sickness, discomfort, the side effects of treatment, and the palpable sorrow of the families who suffer with them. Some never make it to their 2nd birthday. Some attend their senior prom having lost all their hair to the efforts at eradicating their illness. Not I, but these youngsters, truly faced the prospects of a life unfairly stolen by cancer. I had plenty of turns at bat. They don't even get to suit up."

On June 4th, John will be commencing the cross-country *Rallye to Reno* in his TD, heading for the 2011 MG International at Lake Tahoe. He has decided to focus his efforts on raising awareness of pediatric

cancer and hopes to generate donations to **CURE Childhood Cancer**. *CURE* is dedicated to cutting edge research and to providing education and support to young patients and their families. *CURE* funds the development of "targeted therapies" that focus on cancer cells and do not harm surrounding healthy tissue. Targeted therapies are critical to ensuring that patients are spared the devastating and often life-threatening "late effects" caused by current conventional treatments.

John reports he has pretty much neglected his TD since he finished the restoration 30 years ago. Not the best of bets for a 3200-mile rally and return trip. So, he has started going through things to increase his chances. Chapter member and MG Vintage Racer Manley Ford is attending to the motor while John rolls around on the floor in his garage going through brakes, electricals, fuels system, and maybe even adding a cruise control from JC Whitney. TALK WITH FAULK

A QUICK WAY TO FIND OUT WHAT'S HAPPENING INSIDE AN ENGINE

One of the easiest ways to check an engines' operating condition is to inspect the sparks plugs.

1. **Normal**...If the insulator tip ranges in color from grayish-yellow to brown the engine is running correctly, the plug heat range is O.K. and the exhaust should be clean.
2. **Carbon Fouled**...Dull black, velvety carbon deposit. Black smoke from exhaust: the fuel mixture is set too rich, or the automatic choke is sticking. Other problems may also include a too large spark gap, or a plug that's too “cold” to burn away deposits. Correct engine problem or use “hotter” plug.
3. **Oil Fouled**...shiny black film of oil and carbon indicates too much oil in the combustion chamber. Worn or damaged cylinders and piston rings...bad valve stem oil seals. A hotter plug can help burn away these deposits.
4. **Overheated**...Metal beads on insulator tip, eroded electrodes: Mixture too lean, plug not gas-tight or properly installed, badly closing valves or plugs that are too hot for driving conditions.

Put-in-Bay Road Races Reunion Gains Momentum in its Third Year *2011 Version to be Held June 27-29 on Historic Ohio Island*



Key Points Summary:

- Sports car and vintage racing enthusiasts are invited to attend this gathering on Put-in-Bay celebrating the road races held on the island back in the early days of post-war sports car racing.
 - Events include tours of the original course, a car show, a rally to various island locations, storytelling interviews with notable race participants, dedications of permanent commemorative markers around the course, presentations with 50s-era photos and movies and more.
 - Plans are also under way to hold an expanded speed trials event (using the island's airport and to demonstrate converting the airport to a road-race circuit with an eye toward holding a real vintage race at the facility as soon as 2012).
 - Original cars and drivers are especially invited, but all with an interest in re-living the early days of sports car racing in North America will enjoy this low-key gathering.
 - The event is being organized by members of the Put-in-Bay Road Race Heritage Society and will benefit various developments related to preserving the island's storied sports car racing history.

- Put-in-Bay Road Race's memorabilia, photos, movies and artifacts are being sought. Also, sponsorships for permanent markers are available. See contact information at end of this release.

February 4, 2011 — Planning is under way for the **2011 Put-in-Bay Road Races Reunion to take place Monday June 27 to Wednesday June 29**. The event celebrates sports car races held from 1952 to 1959 and once in 1963 on the public roads of Put-in-Bay, a nostalgic enclave on South Bass Island a few miles offshore Northwest Ohio in Lake Erie.

The reunion organizers include Bob Williams, overall event coordinator, and Jack Woshnie who is managing event registration among other responsibilities. Both are well known in U.S. vintage racing and historical preservation circles. Recognizing the growth potential for the event, several local island officials and residents are also participating in the planning for this year's event.

Following similar events in 2009 and 2010, the 2011 Put-in-Bay Sports Car Races Reunion will include original course tours, a rally, car show and open mic interviews with special guests. Adding to the action, and contributing to the interest factor for vintage racers, an expanded speed trials event is being developed as part of the festivities. In 2010 a small-scale gymkhana was held on a taxiway of the island's airport to demonstrate the feasibility of a speed event.

Commented Jack Woshnie, "Local island and Port Authority officials have been impressed by the potential of the 2009 and

2010 events and news highlighted in *Irishness* is certainly a true use of the effort "to fully and in detail attend to what was best for the same ends of small-island cars that served on the island as late as 1950." The goal was a show leading up to the return of actual sports car racing to the island — closed out on the public roads this week in the day — as we go going to use both for racing and the driveway for one-car-at-a-time speed trials." It was fun to the speed trials, says Whelan, "to see what is to set up an actual race course on the aspect that all HICPAR members will have the opportunity to race, most of our private pace-top idea with a pace car and all." Was agreed on exhibition tour of all the cars on small island heart course will present some grade open houses and help create a compelling vision of what this might become as early as 2012."

"A key element in shaping an actual race would be specifically expressed sponsorship interests," and Whelan, noting the expense and effort it takes to convert a street into a safe and suitable venue for participants and spectators alike. "The idea was perhaps in the speed trials this year will play a large role in creating the confidence of a strong well and already progressive in-kind and even contributing sponsors when this is all about."

Sponsors and supporters of the 2010 Put-In-Bay Road Races Reunion include beverage distributor Maple City Inc; John & White Wholesale Medical Supply; Seafood; Lake Erie Islands Historical Society; the Village of Put-In-Bay; John Pines House Bar; The Put-In-Bay Port Authority; Uggies Restaurant; Miller Book Store; and The Put-In-Bay Island Car Club. The 2010 Put-In-Bay Road Races Reunion featured about 100 registered participants and several thousand parked-spectator sports cars, the of which — of which — were on the island in the 1950s. Attention last year featured guest of honor Larry Glickin, an accomplished event organizer in the '50s and '60s, who — due to his garage — was obligated to move on driving skills for some of these Put-In-Bay years. It is hoped that Larry will make a return appearance in 2011.

Antique Plates, Driving and Michigan Tickets

We all love to drive our MGs as much as possible, right? The town governments are hurting for money, right? Both are ‘givens’ in my book. Sometimes that can mean a traffic ticket that is ‘unexpected’. How so? Last year, at the Woodward Cruise, the Detroit Free Press remarked how many antique cars were being stopped by Royal Oak Police and ticketed for using ‘antique plates’ outside of official club events. This was not appreciated by the antique car owners, who, technically, were hard pressed to prove that they were at a club event. Then there is also the average bloke who just wants to go out for a drive and ‘enjoy’ his or her’s MG. Some folk, myself included, drive to work as much as possible in antique cars, mostly MGs.

How to avoid a ticket? Try this. Buried in all of the endless statutes which is not noted on the ‘general’ information pages of the Sec. of State web page, is definition Sec 20a. It states the usual limitations that we all know, such as participation only in club uses, parades , etc, but it also

has the phrase, again not mentioned in the ‘general information’ pages, which is ‘including mechanical testing’. With our MGs, mechanical testing is a way of life, and a ‘given’ each time I drive. So, to avoid a potential ticket, simply place a wrench and/or screwdriver close by in the cockpit, on the floor or seat, and if, by chance, an officer stops you for driving to work, simply pull out your registration, proof of insurance, and a copy of the definition written below, with the ‘including mechanical testing’ highlighted. Show the officer your tools and request that he read the definition. Nine times out of ten he will let you off. On the tenth, go to court and state your case. You will win and the case will be dismissed. Been there, done that.

257.20a "Historic vehicle" defined.

Sec. 20a.

"Historic vehicle" means a vehicle which is over 25 years old, and which is owned solely as a collector's item and for participation in club activities, exhibitions, tours, parades, and similar uses, including mechanical testing, but is not used for general transportation.

History: Add. 1996, Act 404, Eff. Dec. 21, 1996

Pearl Maddox started Mrs. Maddox Cake Shop in 1928. (She became famous for creating Charles A. Lindbergh's wedding cake!) Her son, Jack Still, took over the bakery in Detroit, along with his wife, Marian, and daughters, Susan and Marian. In 1973, he hired Tim Shaberly as a dishwasher and to take deliveries. Tim continued to work as a baker for Sue and Marian when they took over the bakery. Later, they relocated the bakery to Farmington. When they left in 1996, to pursue other careers, they offered the bakery to Tim. Tim's family continues to run the bakery. They still produce many of the same products that Pearl started in 1928.


